Business Meeting

Vice President Winer introduced Thomas Lux, the Henry and Margaret Bourne Professor of Poetry and Director of the McEver Visitng Writer Program and Director of Poetry at Tech. In the course of that introduction, Vice President Winer noted some of Professor Lux's grants, fellowships and publications including his most recent book of poetry, <u>Child Made of Sand published</u> by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, 2012.

Program

Professor Lux reviewed the chain of events and influences which led to his arrival at Tech and noted that Tech was the only major university now having two Endowed Chairs in Poetry. He teaches two classes, one in Poetry Reading and one in Poetry Writing. To him, Community outreach is very important leading to Community Workshops including seven in the Spring Semester and one International Reading per year. With respect to general and engineering education, the study and writing of poetry enhances one's general writing skills and thus has practical educational value. It is something that can be taught.

At the request of the members present, Professor Lux read from one his poems entitled "Refrigerator in 1957."

The meeting was adjourned. Some members gathered in the Student Center Restaurant for lunch.
