The students--17,000 enrolled, 4,000 completed the 1st quiz, 2,000 completed the 5th quiz, 1469 earned a Completion Statement, and 793 earned a Statement of Accomplishment

The second offering—17,994 enrolled, 3042 completed $1^{\rm st}$ quiz, 905 completed the $5^{\rm th}$ quiz, and 566 earned Statement of Accomplishment
