Chemical Oscillations

Spiral Waves

Application to controlling the complex spatiotemporal dynamics of cardiac arrhythmias

Development of a novel low energy control algorithm that could be used clinically and requires only 10% of the energy currently used by standard methods to defibrillate the heart
